Greetings OLMA Families and Faculty,

As a growing and thriving school community, we have more going on and more news to share. So going forward, this means you will be getting newsletters from us a little more often, probably every other week!

Since we have not used all of the snow days that I had included in this year's calendar, I have added two additional days off around Spring Break and Memorial Day. Please see the Important Dates below and plan accordingly. The **school calendar has also been updated** to reflect these additional days off.

A quick update about our New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) **accreditation process**. We had three evaluators that comprise our committee (one from NEASC, and two school administrators from Catholic schools in Massachusetts and Connecticut) with us throughout the day on Tuesday of this week, touring our buildings and holding a series meetings with our staff. The focus of these meetings was Foundation Standards, reviewing our financial and operational procedures primarily. We have not received an official response yet, but all of the meetings went well and we received very positive feedback at the end of the day. We will now be moving forward into the Program Standards phase, which encompasses curriculum and the student experience. We will be spending lots of time in the next six months holding many meetings and preparing documentation for our next series of meetings that will take place over three days in mid-October. NEASC accreditation is both an exciting and challenging process. I will continue to keep everyone informed as we proceed.

As I shared a few weeks ago, many families are struggling with the issue of managing cell phones and other electronics. At the same time, many families also have some great ideas that they implement. We have created a <u>Google Form</u> where I would love to have families share their ideas, tips, suggestions, recommendations, etc. for how you manage technology usage (especially cell phones) with your own children. I believe that hearing some ideas from our very own families within our own school community might be helpful to everyone. Once we get everyone's ideas, we will compile those and share. This will of course be <u>completely anonymous</u>. No one will know who has contributed the ideas. The goal is to put together our own "best practices" that can maybe be helpful. My feeling is that just about everyone is challenged with this issue in some way. So here is <u>the link to the Cell Phone/Electronics Management Google Form</u>. I hope everyone will take a few minutes to share their thoughts of what works for them and even what has not worked. It could go a long way towards helping another family. We are all in this together.

EDUCATION TAX CREDIT SCHOLARSHIPS

The application is open for 2022-2023 for NH Education Tax Credit Scholarships. <u>The</u> <u>**DEADLINE to apply is MAY 6.**</u> The eligibility is:

 You must be a New Hampshire resident.
You must have a child/children between the ages of 5 and 20 who is entering
Kindergarten or 1st grade for the first time <u>OR</u> entering 2nd-12th grades and coming from a public school.

3. Your household income must not exceed 300% of the federal poverty level. See income chart below.

EDUCATION FREEDOM ACCOUNTS

The application is open for 2022-2023 for NH Education Freedom Accounts. You can direct part of your child's state education funding to pay for tuition at SJRS/OLMA. The DEADLINE to apply is JULY 15.

The eligibility is:

- 1. You must be a New Hampshire resident.
- 2. Your child must be at least 5 years old and no older than 20 years old and **entering Kindergarten 12th grade**.

3. Your household income must not exceed 300% of the federal poverty level. See income chart below.

Both of the above programs are administered by the **Children's Scholarship Fund New Hampshire**, and applications are currently being accepted for new and returning families . The applications for both programs are simple and entirely online. We strongly encourage everyone who is eligible to apply as soon as possible. Many of our families receive funding from these great programs. There is a combined application for the programs so that you may apply for both at the same time, if you qualify for both. **You may receive funding from BOTH programs if eligible.
