



Our Lady of Mercy Academy Service Hour Program

To cultivate “mercy in action” through the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy and themes of self-gift expressed in the classroom, students are required to complete 15 hours of Christian service for each school year. This service is to be geared toward filling basic needs of others in the community (food, shelter, physical and mental health, etc.), without payment and beyond normal family life expectations. Examples include, though are not limited to, clearing a neighbor’s driveway of leaves or snow, writing letters to residents of nursing homes, Altar serving during Mass, picking up trash in a neighborhood, and volunteering with an organization like Community Kitchen. A list of organizations is below to jumpstart ideas for places to contact in pursuit of service opportunities.
