As we went to press, it was just announced that "Habemus Papam!" We have a new Pope! Our schools have been on a Pope Watch the past few days, learning about the College of Cardinals, the rituals for when a Pope dies, and the process for electing a new Pope.

Imagine the excitement, and maybe surprise when the name of the new Pope was given, Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost, from Chicago. Our students have seen history first hand because Cardinal Prevost is the first American to ever be chosen as Pope.

We pray for our new Pope, Pope Leo XIV, and look forward to learning more about his vision for the Church.

Note: Some classes participated in a contest for who would be the next Pope. Grades 2, 5, and 7 all picked Cardinal Prevost, so congratulations to them and their teachers...they certainly knew how to read the Conclave.

Speaking of teachers, we are in Teacher and Staff Appreciation Week. Thank you to the Student Leadership and generous parents who have organized the treats and kind acts for staff this week. Our staff deserve every bit of it!

And while we are on the topic of our awesome staff, I can tell you that we recently completed a staff compensation study (thanks to the gift of a school parent whose company does this type of research) to look at our salary structure and other employment factors. This is part of an ongoing effort to address the needs of our staff in the areas of equitable pay, professional development, and organizational structure. We will be meeting with teachers in the coming weeks to sign contracts, establish schedules, and have more conversations about extra-curricular opportunities for our students.

In these conversations, we will be making sure that we continue to provide all of the major curriculum components that both SJRS and OLMA need for a rigorous education based on the Catholic intellectual tradition. Even though there will be a transition of some staff members, students will still be receiving classes in math, science, social studies, religion, world languages, art, music, PE, and technology. At OLMA, we will be adding a Composition class to strengthen student writing skills. At SJRS, we will be dividing the ELA classes into separate English and Literature classes to make sure students receive the necessary instructional minutes to master all language skills. We will be updating our class schedules to reflect changes, and the fact that both schools will now share more teachers in common. This restructuring is a way for us to utilize the expertise of our teachers as well as their passion for what they teach with all grade levels. A final part of the conversations with staff is to reimagine our electives courses, based on the ideas and talents of new and returning staff (and yes, we will also be asking for the input of students!) so that our programs not only offer the vital, traditional curriculum that any college-bound student needs, but also fun and interesting selections.

I will continue to update parents as we finalize more decisions and have more specifics to offer.

Over the course of quarter three, all of Mrs. Hoye's science classes worked on **Genius Projects**, where they focused solely on developing a new skill or meeting a specific goal. At the end of the quarter, they each presented TED-talks about their in-depth work and the challenges they faced along the way. There were a full range of projects including art forms such as writing, learning guitar, crochet, weaving friendship bracelets, drawing, animation, film studies, cardistry, video editing, creating a new board game, cooking, baking, and even carving a game-ready baseball bat and sewing a hand puppet. Other projects focused on hitting new reading goals, researching WW2 or AI, video game challenges, skiing, automotive work, soccer skills, learning a new language, cricut projects, meeting fitness goals, dog training, creating a business and a non-profit organization, and researching the science behind alien sightings.

## **SPRING BREAK TRIP TO FRANCE**

Over the Spring Break, 16 OLMA students traveled to France with Mr. Sully and SJRS/OLMA parent Mrs. Kangas! ## 2025-2026 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION

As we continue preparations for the 2025-26 school year, please carefully review all of the financial assistance information below. For those in need of financial assistance, the process includes multiple steps. The following steps, in this order, are required by all those applying for financial assistance:

- 1. Submit application for NH Education Freedom Accounts (new and renewals).
- 2. Submit application for NH Education Tax Credit Scholarship (renewals only).
- 3. Submit application for Diocese of Manchester Scholarships.
- 4. For Parish of the Holy Spirit families, apply to the Parish tuition assistance fund. Other Catholic families should contact their home parishes.
- 5. Submit FACTS application to be eligible for the Lamothe Adopt-a-Student Fund, Nielsen Scholarship Fund, and the Winnie Morenz Scholarship.

## **EDUCATION FREEDOM ACCOUNTS (EFA)**

The application is open for 2025-2026 for NH Education Freedom Accounts. The deadline is <u>July</u> <u>15</u>.

- 1. You must be a New Hampshire resident.
- 2. Your child must be at least 5 years old and no older than 20 years old and entering Kindergarten 12th grade.
- 3. Your household income must not exceed 350% of the federal poverty level. (See income chart below.)

## **EDUCATION TAX CREDIT (ETC) SCHOLARSHIPS**

The application is open for <u>RENEWALS</u> for 2025-2026 for NH Education Tax Credit Scholarships. **CLICK HERE for details.** 

The EFA and ETC programs are administered by the **Children's Scholarship Fund New Hampshire**. The applications for both programs are simple and online. We strongly encourage everyone who is eligible to apply ASAP. Many of our families receive funding from these great programs. There is a combined application for the programs so that you may apply/renew for both at the same time, if you qualify for both. You may receive funding from BOTH programs, if eligible.



## SCHOOL-BASED FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

After submitting the above applications, you may seek additional help through our school-based financial assistance (Lamothe Adopt-a-Student Fund, Nielsen Scholarship Fund, Winnie Morenz Scholarship). You must complete the FACTS application, and your eligibility will be reviewed. The deadline is May 15. CLICK HERE to complete the FACTS application.
